From The Pastor



What is a Seder?

The Seder celebrates the great Jewish feast of the Passover where they remember their redemption and liberation from their bondage in Egypt. The word “Passover” signifies the Lord’s passing over the houses of the children of Israel (Ex. 12:27). It is also known as the feast of the “Unleavened Bread,” since in their haste to flee Egypt, “the people carried off their dough, still unleavened” (Ex 12:34). It is a festival of great rejoicing, which reveals how God “led us from captivity to freedom, from sadness to joy, from mourning to feasting, from servitude to redemption, from darkness to brilliant light.”

The Seder involves a ritual meal which commemorates the events of the Exodus. Its purpose is to pass on the story, that is the central event in Jewish history, to future generations. As Christians, our own spiritual roots are also connected to this meal. It was celebrated by Jesus at his “Last Supper” with the Apostles, when he instituted the Eucharist, thus passing on and re-enacting the central event of Christianity—the life, death, and resurrection of Christ.

At the Seder meal, Jewish families gather around a table in their homes. Their sharing symbolizes their freedom and their consciousness as a people of God.

At a Christian Seder we gather together as family around the table of Christian fellowship to celebrate our freedom from sin and our union with God. This celebration is the original context of the Catholic Mass, which is the commemoration and renewal of the “Last Supper,” and it is therefore fitting to incorporate elements of the Jewish Seder into a “Seder Mass”. Such a celebration is based, on but goes beyond, the Jewish Seder in that it symbolizes and actually brings about our freedom as persons, our salvation from sin and our oneness with God.

Our celebration at BSP will take place in the Parish Hall and it will have three parts: elements of the Jewish Seder, the Eucharistic Rite and a festive dinner. The Seder rite is accompanied by commentary and ritual actions including a symbolic meal in 15 ritualized steps that include: washings, readings, prayers of blessing and thanksgiving, eating bitter herbs, eggs and matzah bread and drinking wine. For the sake of brevity, these will be celebrated, on our behalf, only by those at the “high table” as the first part of our Seder Mass—the Liturgy of the Word. The readings are from Exodus, Paul’s letter to the Ephesians and Luke’s account of the Last Supper. When these rites are concluded, we will begin the Eucharistic Rite of the Mass. After the Mass, because the Seder involves a complete meal, it is fitting that we all participate in a festive dinner.

A Lenten Message from Pope Francis

The following is from part of Pope Francis’s Lenten message: “The Word is a gift, other persons are a gift”.

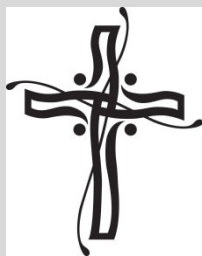
“Lent is a new beginning, a path leading to the certain goal of Easter, Christ’s victory over death. This season urgently calls us to conversion. Even when we sin, he patiently awaits our return; by that patient expectation, he shows us his readiness to forgive. Lent is the favorable season for renewing our encounter with Christ, living in his word, in the sacraments and in our neighbor. The Lord, who overcame the deceptions of the Tempter during the forty days in the desert, shows us the path we must take.

“May the Holy Spirit lead us on a true journey of conversion, so that we can rediscover the gift of God’s word, be purified of the sin that blinds us, and serve Christ present in our brothers and sisters in need. Let us pray for one another so that, by sharing in the victory of Christ, we may open our doors to the weak and poor. Then we will be able to experience and share to the full the joy of Easter”.

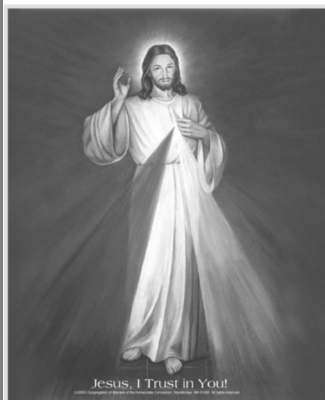
